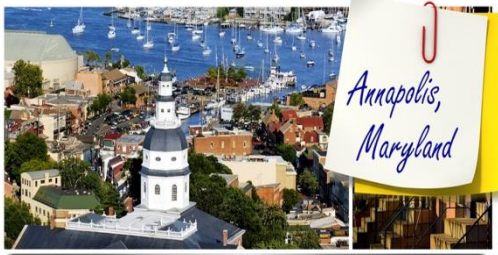
Ocean City, MD: Looking to great local place. Pack up beach. Once there walk eats, and play in the ocean. amusement theme park, boat and visit the wild

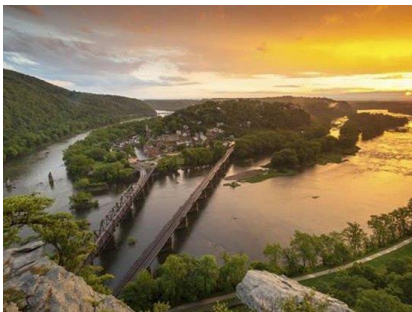

Baltimore, MD: Lots of history to be learned throughout the seaport of Baltimore, did you know that located at the mouth of the inner harbor sits Fort McHenry, birthplace of the U.S. national anthem, "The Star-Spangled Banner." Tired of history visit the national aquarium or catch a baseball game- Go Orioles or even a football game-Go Ravens spending on what time of year you visit.

Harpers Ferry, WV: A historic town in Jefferson County where the Shenandoah River and Potomac River meet.
